

## **Europub – a social place in which locals and strangers meet**

How to be familiar with the projects and organisational background of participants? How to find potential partners for future co-operation?

The Infopack of the Training Course refers to an NGO Agora often organised at international courses to get to know each other's organisational background through a small exhibition and free interactions. This need of participants will be addressed in an other way at our training course, namely in Europub.

### **English pub**

Why Europub? Because of the English pub. It has been being a fundamental part of the English culture and an institution in itself for hundreds years. If you haven't been to a pub, you haven't been to England. At the heart of every community is the pub: a meeting place to socialise on something approaching, drink and enjoy yourself. Friends, colleagues, locals of any class as well as strangers are equally welcome.

### **Europub**

Well, it is just a modest simulation of English pub on the 7<sup>th</sup> of May, to meet and have talks, mainly about youth work on/for/through European citizenship.

### **Who and what's there?**

Your fellow participants, invited English youth workers and other guests, information about their work for European citizenship and active citizenship, drinks, jukebox, games, pub quiz and maybe some other entertainment – it is up to you!

### **Opening and happy hours**

7 May, 16.30 – 24.00. No lock-in and no “revolution starts at closing time!” Sorry.

### **Price deal**

Europub is even more democratic than the English pub. This time you do not have to pay for your drink - in case you bring something typical from your region or country.

### **What to bring with you?**

- Some drink and snacks typical in your place. Keep in mind that beer is traditionally better value in English pubs than wines and spirit. Alcopops and non-alcoholic beverages are also very welcome.
- Some examples of your youth work (leaflets, fliers, videos, photos, CDs, etc.), in connection to citizenship. Please focus on good practice (actions, projects), obstacles or unresolved problems, and future plans or offers for co-operation of your organisation in relation to the key aspects of European Citizenship, such as participation or citizenship actions. You will have a chance to introduce your work in the Europub in small group settings.
- One of your favourite songs from your culture for the Jukebox – on CD, MP3, etc. or you can sing it to the audience.
- Some questions related to your culture, for the pub quiz.
- Maybe a table card or any pub game, popular in your country and some entertaining artistic contribution?
